New Recycling Opportunity!

Drop-off containers await your soft plastic: grocery bags, product wrap, resealable food storage bags, dry cleaning bags, bubble wrap, plastic shipping envelopes.

NO plastic bottles or takeout containers.

NO food residue. Must be clean and dry.

There's one box in each building, on the garage level, near the foodscraps collection chest or closet, close to the elevator or inside the garage door. The list of approved items is posted next to each drop-off container.

Partnership With School District Not only are we keeping our plastic film out of the trash; we're also helping Washington Irving School earn a FREE NexTrex "Buddy Bench" made from the plastic, to be placed in the schoolyard. The challenge? to collect 1,000 pounds of plastic by June 30th!

What Is a Buddy Bench?

Materials sent out to School District families explained: "A buddy bench is a way for students to signal to others that they need a friend to play with or someone to talk to, allowing other children on the playground to see when someone needs support ..." Buddy Bench = No One Alone. Let's Help WI Reach the Finish Line! Washington Irving students, faculty, and parents have already collected 850 pounds of plastic. Now our Kendal plastics can help clear the final hurdle — 1000 pounds of plastic to be reused and turned into a Buddy Bench!
