



### Madman or Genius? Beethoven's Late String Quartets

Celebrate ANY month with Beethoven! "Mad," "incomprehensible," "repulsive," "ludicrous," "rambling," "outrageous," "mystifying" – those were just a few of the words prominent critics and experienced listeners in the 1820s used to describe Ludwig van Beethoven's last works. His music was always intense, dramatic, and hyper-expressive. But his late works inhabited realms – mystical, ethereal, untamed, primal – that baffled and sometimes offended his audiences. Travel to those regions we now regard as sublime and awe-inspiring to hear what Beethoven – deaf by then – "heard" in his mind in some of the most enduring and profoundly expressive musical works ever composed! If you have not enrolled in the course, you can pay at the door on August 2.

### New Trips

Wed, Aug 10, Untermyer Gardens, Yonkers: formerly one of the most celebrated gardens in the U.S., the 150-acre Samuel Untermyer estate overlooking the Hudson, had gardens designed about 1916 by Beaux Arts architect Welles Bosworth. Open weekly to the public in the 1920s and 1930s, the gardens became ruins after Untermyer's death in 1940. The Untermyer Gardens Conservancy and the City of Yonkers, which owns 43 core acres, are now restoring the gardens to their former glory with increased funds, more horticulturalists and many new plantings. Come see this work in progress in summer when the gardens are most brilliant.

Wed, Aug 24, Met Breuer, New York: First Kendall visit to the Met's new space, the building designed by Marcel Breuer, formerly the Whitney Museum; two major exhibitions: "Unfinished -- Thoughts Left Visible," 197 works from the Renaissance to modern and contemporary art left uncompleted, giving insight into the process of their creation including Michelangelo, Rembrandt, Turner, Cezanne, Jackson Pollock and Robert Rauschenberg; and "diane arbus in the beginning" (1923-1971) with 100 remarkable photographs from the first seven years of her career, most of which have never been exhibited.
