A small program change on **Sat, Feb 18** (*Carmen* will be rescheduled) allows us to present an **introduction** that includes Chéreau, Boulez, the singers Gwyneth Jones and Donald McIntyre; RW's grandson Wolfgang Wagner, his greatgranddaughter Friedelind Wagner, and the TV director Brian Large. **Das** *Rheingold* follows on **Sat, Feb 25.**

## Marjorie Gilbert, Alida 4219


Marjorie Gilbert plans to move from her home in Croton-on-Hudson to her Alida apartment on Friday, Feb 17.
