July 24 Program Marc Cheshire "Building the New Croton Dam"

Two weeks ago, we learned about the construction of the 41-mile Old Croton Aqueduct which provided running water from the Croton River to NYC from 1842 until 1965.

Croton-on-Hudson Village Historian Marc Cheshire will tell us about the building of the new Croton Dam, an engineering marvel. For 14 years (1892-1906), as many as 1,000 workers used more than 500 pieces of heavy machinery, 745,000 barrels of cement, 100,000 tons of coal, and an incalculable quantity of locally quarried stone to build the dam.

The Croton Dam is said to be the third largest hand-hewn structure in the world after the Great Pyramid of Giza and the Great Wall of China. Mr. Cheshire will describe the construction process from selecting the site to laying the last stone.



July 26 Program Dr. Thomas Frieden "Covid and Other Pandemics: How to Stop Them"

Dr. Frieden (son of Nancy F.) is the former Commissioner of the New York City Department of Health and Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. He is currently President and CEO of Resolve to Save Lives.

Tom will review what has been learned from the Covid pandemic and other health threats and how to better protect the U.S. and the world. Public health action has resulted in most health improvements over the past century and is expected to further improve health, reduce disability and boost economic productivity in the future. He will discuss what is needed for more health protection and progress to occur.
