November 13 Program Michele Beckerman "The Rockefeller Archive Center: An Illustrated Introduction"

Established in 1974 as a division of Rockefeller University, The Rockefeller Archive Center was created to assemble, process, and make available for scholarly research, the papers of the Rockefeller family and the records of various philanthropic and educational institutions they founded.

Currently the Center's collections include the archives of the Ford Foundation, the Commonwealth Fund, the Russell Sage Foundation, the John L. and James S. Knight Foundation, and the Social Science Research Council, among many others.

On Nov. 13, at 7:30 pm in the Gathering Room, Senior Curator Michele Beckerman will present interesting stories about the Archive Center's collections – including some stories about the Rockefellers and the philanthropies whose records are housed at the Center.

Foreign Policy Discussion "Sanctions of All Types"

Residents are invited to view a Zoom lecture sponsored by the Chappaqua Foreign Policy Group at 10 am on Monday, November 13 in the GR. Sanctions of all types have been a weapon in the West's efforts to weaken and discourage bad actors from disrupting the world order. Guest speaker Thibault Denamiel, Center for Strategic and International Studies, focuses on the intersection of trade and U.S. national security and trade policy as a diplomatic tool.

She received her master's and doctoral degrees in music and piano performance from the University of Michigan School of Music. Her Kendal program at 3 pm in the Gathering Room, will include sonatas by Liszt and Schubert.

Dec. 6, Wed: Dreyfus Foundation Museum of Art, Mt. Kisco

The art collection at The Dreyfus Foundation comprises the works of self-taught and contemporary artists, and a unique collection of 20th - 21st century artists and art works from the Louis-Dreyfus Family Collection.

The special exhibition "Marvels of My Own Inventiveness" includes some 22 paintings by five contemporary Black artists in the American Folk Art Museum collection: Leonard Daley, Claude Lawrence, J.B. Murray, Mary T. Smith, and Purvis Young. There is always something new and unusual to see in this museum. We will have a docent tour.

Living Sustainably: Kendal's New Plant Disposal Location

Thanks to Bob Michael and Ryan Brown of Brightview Landscaping, Kendal now has a proper disposal spot for your dying summer plants and plant cuttings. It is on the south side of the property, opposite the entry to the cul-de-sac and behind the berm.

As you approach the walkway to Sleepy Hollow Manor, but <u>before</u> you reach the gate, you will see on your right a large cleared area, marked with posts and blue string. Please bring the plant materials you wish to discard to this spot.

Do not discard any plant pots or plastic plant markers there. This spot is for plant materials only and, used appropriately, enhances our efforts to be kind to Kendal's beautiful landscape.

Disposal of Batteries

Gjekote Curanaj, Senior Manager for Facilities, advises that used alkaline batteries (A-AAA) should be put into your bagged garbage and placed into the trash bin/dumpster. You need not take them to the front desk.

All other single-use batteries and rechargeable batteries are collected for recycling. Bring them to the Activities Alcove (between Gathering Room and Lounge, opposite the Computer Room) and place them in a marked box on the right side of the counter. They will then be stored and picked up by a contracted vendor.
