# Dec. 18 Program Karin Limburg: Fish Whispering: Exploring Environmental Impacts and Life History from Fish Chemistry

The daughter of Maggie and Peter Limburg, Dr. Karin Limburg is a Distinguished Professor in the Department of Environmental Biology at the SUNY College of Environmental Science and Forestry, in Syracuse.

The Hudson River estuary and watershed have served as a home base of her study. All the same, longstanding interest and work in Sweden expanded her research into the Baltic Sea, the globe's largest anthropogenic dead zone, and into other regions around the world.

In her lecture — in the Gathering Room at 7:30 pm — Karin will explain how fish interact with the biogeochemistry of their environments. Many of these interactions are recorded in various parts of their bodies, some for short periods and others for a lifetime. Limburg will introduce us to some of the environmental tracer methods. focusing on case studies of Cape Cod's urbanization; impacts of hydropower dams; and effects of "marine dead zones" on fishes from the Baltic Sea, Gulf of Mexico, and Lake Erie.
