County Executive George S. Latimer returns on **April 10 at 7:30 pm** to give us an update on what's happening in the County.

Prior to his election in November 2017, Latimer was a member of the NYS Senate for the 37th District. Previously he served on the Rye City Council, in the Westchester County Legislature, and in the New York State Assembly.

Born in Mt. Vernon, he graduated with a B.A. from Fordham and earned a Master's in Public Administration from NYU's Wagner School.

By profession, he is a marketing executive with over 20 years at major corporate subsidiaries of Nestle and ITT, with on-site responsibilities for projects with AT&T, IBM, and Shearson Lehman. During that time, he had direct involvement with project development in numerous sites nationwide.
