# August 21 Program Barbara Davis "Leading Ladies of Westchester Stage, Screen, and TV"

Beginning with the silent movie stars of the Thanhouser Film Corporation in New Rochelle (1909-1918) and D. W. Griffith's studios in Mamaroneck (1919-1924), Westchester has been home to some of America's finest female actors in film, stage, and television.

This presentation will cover the lives and careers of many of these women, as well as the allure of our Westchester communities. You will be amazed at the number of stars who have made Westchester their home, including Billy Burke, Julie Harris, Eartha Kitt, Glenn Close – and many more.

Barbara Davis, Co-Director of the Westchester County Historical Society, is the author/producer of dozens of articles and media presentations chronicling the history and features of Westchester County.

# Great Course Programming on Channel 970

On the weekend of Aug 26/27, we will conclude the series, "The World's Greatest Geological Wonders" with two lectures that could not be played earlier in the season (see p.1).

Starting the weekend of Sept 2/3, we begin a timely new series, "History of the Supreme Court," which will run through December 30.

The Supreme Court has defined the limits of our speech and actions since its first meeting in 1790.

This 36-lecture series is led by Peter Irons, Emeritus Professor of Political Science at the University of California, San Diego. He earned his undergraduate degree from Antioch College and his M.A. and Ph.D. in Political Science from Boston University. His J.D. is from Harvard Law School, where he served as senior editor of the Harvard Civil Rights-Civil Liberties Law Review.
