# August 7 Program Mary Jo Ziezel "The Vibrant Future of the Jacob Burns Film Center"

As we continue to highlight the historic and cultural setting of KoH, we turn to the Jacob Burns Film Center (JBFC) in Pleasantville.

JBFC opened in 2001 as a nonprofit educational and cultural institution dedicated to presenting the best of independent, documentary, and world cinema; promoting visual literacy; and making film a vibrant part of the community.

In 2021, Mary Jo Ziezel was chosen as JBFC's Executive Director, following two decades with the American Ballet Theatre. Her Aug 7 presentation will highlight upcoming programming and education initiatives and introduce us to the people behind the JBFC's dynamic programming (sharing some "sneak peaks").

Ms. Ziezel holds a BA degree from the University of Wisconsin as well as an MA in Performing Arts Administration/Nonprofit Management from NYU. She is a doctoral candidate in Organization Leadership/Arts Education and Evaluation at Teachers College at Columbia.

The Bruce Museum's 139-year-old building has been renovated and houses a collection of about 15,000 objects representing the arts and sciences. It was recently voted the best museum in Fairfield County.

Here's a brief sample of its extensive and varied exhibits: Elie Nadelman's sculptures using innovative materials exploring figure, form, and abstraction; paintings from private collections showcasing American modernism; contemporary Black art (1968-2021) showing legacies of slavery, Civil Rights Era, and current themes; "Plexus" installation using multicolor threads; mineral gallery with over 100 unusual and rare crystals; science galleries with fossils, birds, and ecosystems; textile collections, including clothing.
