The Katonah Museum of Art is an innovative visual arts museum with a diverse range of exhibitions in its galleries and on its grounds. The current exhibitions are: "Wu Chi-Tsung Synchronicity"—collage and photography interpreting traditional Chinese landscape paintings, and a video installation and immersive installation by the artist; and "The Bluest of Blues"—original art from a children's picture book by Fiona Robinson, combining botany and cyanotype, a photographic printing process. For the images, Robinson created digital "collages" from drawings, watercolors, photographs, cyanotypes, and other flat materials. We will have a docent tour of the exhibitions.
