Hudson Canyon: Building Support for a New Marine Sanctuary

About 100 miles southeast of NYC is the beginning of the Hudson Canyon, the largest submarine canyon along the US's Atlantic Coast. In depth and scale, it rivals the Grand Canyon. Home to hundreds of wildlife species, from giant and threatened whales and dolphins, sharks, and sea turtles, to soaring seabirds and deep-sea corals, it also houses numerous species important to fisheries-tilefish, squid, crabs, flounder, and tunas--and other species important to ecotourism.

Noah Chesnin, Associate Director for the Wildlife Conservation Society's New York Seascape program, has led the organization's work to nominate Hudson Canyon as a National Marine Sanctuary. He served as Chair of the Aquarium Conservation Partnership, a consortium of 26 U.S. aquariums working collaboratively on conservation policy.

April 2 Concert

Violin virtuoso Elizabeth Pitcairn returns for another musical program also featuring pianist Barbara Podgurski and students from the Luzerne Music Center in upstate New York. Following the students' presentations, Ms. Pitcairn and Ms. Podgurski will perform works by Vitali, Gershwin, and Vivaldi.

New Great Courses Program to Start Weekend of April 15

The World's Greatest Geological Wonders: 36 Spectacular Sites

This course takes us to the world's most spectacular geological wonders, explains the forces that have formed them, and tells us the stories that have grown up around them. Its goal is to heighten our appreciation for the world in which we live.

Leading the course is Michael E. Wysession, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Earth and Planetary Sciences, Washington University in St. Louis. An established leader in seismology and geophysical education and author or editor of more than 20 science textbooks, he is Chair of the National Science Foundation's Earth Science Literacy Initiative.

The 36 half-hour lectures will be broadcast on both Saturday and Sunday afternoons, from 3 to 4 pm over Channel 970. Look for the schedule on page 1 of Spotlight.
