May 1 Program, 7:30 pm on ZOOM Robert Sand "What Is Justice?"

Robert Sand, son of former Kendal residents Ann and Leonard Sand, is a professor and founding director of the Center for Justice Reform at Vermont Law and Graduate School (VLGS).

Before joining the faculty on a full-time basis, he served for 15 years as the elected state's attorney (DA) for Windsor County, VT. At VLGS, he started the restorative justice program including both a Master of Arts and a Professional Certificate in Restorative Justice. He has extensive trial and appellate experience and is a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers.

In his talk, Robert will compare and contrast conventional responses in the criminal legal system with restorative responses and ask the Kendal audience to explore their own understanding and perception of what makes a just response. In preparation for the talk, be sure to read the case, "An Introductory Problem," distributed to residents' cubbies. Stan A. will send a Zoom invitation to residents over the weekend.
