Africans Rain Garden, Yonkers

Untermyer Gardens, a public park in Yonkers, has 43 acres of formal gardens on a former estate that once had covered 150 acres overlooking the Hudson River. The restoration project created a walled garden of Indo-Persian design, a vista of the river modeled after Villa D'Este in Italy, terraced gardens, "The Temple of Love" rock garden, and other themed planting areas. Poison Ivy Alert

Kendal residents who walk the trail to the "top of the hill" (Rockwood Hall foundation) and the Lower (River) Trail are advised of the already rampant growth of poison ivy.

Don't pull any weeds which often grow next to poison ivy.

Poison ivy is native to the eastern US and eastern Canada and despite its aggressive spread cannot be considered invasive. It's also not a "poison," but has a noxious oil that can survive for five years.

Poison ivy is green in the summer and reddish brown in the fall.

Remember the saying: "Leaves of three, let it be."
