James Ketterer is a Senior Fellow at the Center for Civic Engagement at Bard College. He recently completed a 4-year term as a Dean at the American University in Cairo. He previously served in Egypt as Country Director for AMIDEAST, an American educational NGO.

At Bard he was Dean of International Studies and Director of the Bard Globalization and International Affairs Program, and taught courses on diplomacy and the Middle East. He was Deputy Provost and Vice Chancellor at the State University of New York, where he was also Director of the Center for International Development. He has also worked with the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe and in the New York Senate and the National Security Council. This is his fifth Kendal lecture.
