Program: Nicholas Wapshott "Don't Tell Anyone, But We're in the Second Year of World War Three" Gathering Room at 7:30 pm

When Putin occupied the Crimea, then invaded Ukraine in a failed attempt to oust President Zelensky and replaced the elected government with Kremlin stooges, he inadvertently set off something many of us have been thinking about for most of our lives: The Third World War.

More than a dispute between neighbors, this could be the final round in an ideological battle—between the democracies and the totalitarians—that laid a curse on the 20th century. As the vengeful peace terms of World War One inexorably led to the Second World War just 20 years later, so the seeds of the current world war lie in the unfinished business of the second world conflict.

Nicholas Wapshott's career began as a journalist for *The Scotsman* in Edinburgh, the *London Times* and the *London Observer*. He

came to the U.S. in 2001 and has worked for a wide array of American publications. He has written 10 biographies about show business people, politicians, and great economists.
